
Lake Hood Seaplane Base to Add Gates for Increased Safety

Lake Hood Seaplane Base will be adding two pilot radio-controlled sliding gates on Lakeshore Taxiway, near Lake Hood gravel strip (Z41), that should be operational by December 15, 2010.

The gates will prevent pedestrians and vehicles from entering onto the gravel airstrip and from walking on Lakeshore Taxiway. Lake Hood is recognized as the world's busiest floatplane base and there has been an increase in pedestrian traffic. In an effort to keep all users of Lake Hood safe it was decided to add the gates.

Pedestrians are welcome to continue to walk, run, or visit the airport however for their own safety everyone should use Aircraft and Lakeshore Drives. Always use extreme caution when entering areas shared with aircraft; make sure you look and listen for airplanes at all times. For more information, please call the Lake Hood office at 907.266.2741.
