

Homer Lake Street Rehabilitation Project No: Z524610000

Project Scope

The Alaska Department of Transportation and Public Facilities (DOT&PF), in cooperation with the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), is proposing to rehabilitate Lake Street between the Sterling Highway and Pioneer Avenue/East End Road. The purpose of this project is to extend the service life of the roadway, improve pedestrian and bicycle facilities, and improve general safety and drainage. The proposed work will include:

- Rehabilitate 2,500 feet of pavement
- Widen the road to the west and add designated bike lanes to both sides of the road
- Improve the Sterling Hwy intersection
- Reconstruct curb/gutter and sidewalk on the east side of the road
- Re-establish existing ditches
- Improve drainage by replacing failing culverts
- Acquire Right-of-Way interests, as needed
- Relocate utilities, as needed



Current Status

DOT&PF has been appraising and acquiring property required for construction. The design process is ongoing and is nearing 95%..

Schedule

Construction is expected to begin in mid-to-late Summer, 2019, and is dependent upon completion of Right-of-Way acquisition, utility coordination, funding allocations, and obtaining necessary permits. The next design review, 95% is scheduled for early 2019.
