

WHAT EXACTLY IS THE OJT PROGRAM?

AUTHORITY: 23 CFR, PART 230, SUBPART A

The FHWA On-the-Job Training (OJT) Program requires the State transportation agencies (STAs) to establish apprenticeships and training programs targeted to move women, minorities, and disadvantaged individuals into journey-level positions to ensure that a competent workforce is available to meet highway construction hiring needs, and to address the historical under-representation of members of these groups in highway construction skilled crafts.








OUR GOAL

01. Vision

The overarching goal of the OJT/SS Program is to significantly increase the presence of skilled individuals within the highway construction industry, while simultaneously enhancing the accessibility of career pathways in transportation-related fields.

02. Mission

The OJT/SS program strives to equip qualified individuals from these demographics with the required skills and knowledge needed to seamlessly integrate into the workforce, thereby fostering both personal and professional growth.


ALASKA CONSTRUCTION **CAREER DAY**



HOW DOES THE OJT PROGRAM TIE IN WITH THE DBE PROGRAM?


DBE Program
