American Airlines to Offer New Summer Seasonal Service to Dallas and Chicago in 2020

Beginning in May 7, 2020, Fairbanks residents and visitors alike will be able to catch American Airlines flights out of Fairbanks International Airport seven days a week.

The flights connecting Fairbanks to Chicago O'Hare International Airport and Dallas-Fort Worth International Airport will run every day of the week between May and October, adding flight options for visitors and locals.

Airport Manager Angie Spear said service from American Airlines has been long in the works.

"We've been working with American Airlines for many, many years to get them to initiate service into Fairbanks, so this is really exciting," Spear said Friday. "The timing was right for them and for us, so this really is just a culmination of a long process."

Spear said the airport is always getting requests from Fairbanks area residents for additional flight options, and those requests combined with working with Explore Fairbanks will provide locals and visitors with additional choices.

How to Ride the Bus
 First, look at the map on the back of this brochure to find which color bus line (Red, Blue, Green, etc.) takes you to where you want to go. You may need to ride more than one bus to get to your final destination. Let the driver know if you need to connect with another bus. You must pay the fare each time you change buses, unless you purchase a Day or Monthly Pass. Once you know the color bus line, go to www.macstransit.com or pick up that route's brochure to see what time the bus will stop near where you want to board. Timed stops are listed in the schedules. The maps show timed and other bus stops as well as popular destinations. Finally, look for the roadside bus stop signs. They are usually found to have blocks apart. Each bus stop has a schedule and map provided for your convenience. Try to be at the stop about five minutes early. If you have any questions, please ask the driver. Welcome aboard!
