Some Information about the Alaska DOT&PF Transportation Program

- •Alaska's transportation program is truly multi-modal, utilizing highways, airports, rail and vessel ferries to provide transportation to Alaskans;
- •Approximately 1/3 of Alaskan communities are accessible by road or highway the rest are accessible by air or ferry;
- •Alaska DOT owns and maintains more than 245 airports ranging from international airports to small village airports;

Alaska's Approach to Bringing the Benefits of Federal Aid Construction to Rural Alaska

- •Alaska DOT hosted a "Partnering for Alaska Native Employment" sessions with Alaska Natives, Contractors, Unions and Alaska DOT staff byproduct was Post Award Conferences
- •Administrative Order 199 signed by Governor Knowles directed the DOT to conduct "Post Award" meetings to coordinate efforts for Native employment between the Contractor, the Tribe and the DOT
- •DOT developed a consultation protocol for government to government relations with Alaska Tribes
- •Work with the Tribal Service providers, identified individuals community opportunities

Alaska's Approach to Bringing the Benefits of Federal Aid Construction to Rural Alaska(continued)

- •Village representatives prepares a village resume detailing the resources available to a contractor in the village (people trained and their qualifications, equipment, housing, etc.)
- •Evaluate other opportunities for work related to the construction contract DBEs in the local area, village coop providing fuel at a profit, water, gravel resources, etc
- •Designate a training positions on these projects when possible (currently only Highway Projects)

Results Reported

- Employment on some projects has been as high as 80% local hire
- Reduced cost to contractor for housing and per diem
- Greatly improved community relationship between ADOT&PF and the Project host community

Focus of Effort

- Focus is on circulating more of the contract funds through the local community
- Intent is to not only create more local opportunities for income but also building a trained workforce for future large civil construction project
