
Alaska International Airports System

- Fuel Stability




AIAS FY07 - FY11 YTD Monthly Reported Combined Cargo - Pax CMGTW As of August 31, 2010

Akiachak, Chignik Lagoon, Kipnuk, Kongiganak, Ouzinkie, Takotna, Tuluksak, Chefornak

Southeast Region: Petersburg, Sitka



Rural Airports 2011 New Construction Activity


Northern Region: Deadhorse, Manley, Gulkana, Kotzebue
