Dear Alaska State Legislator:

Enclosed is the Alaska Marine Highway System (AMHS) Annual Financial Report for Fiscal Year (FY) 2024 (ended June 30, 2024) as required by AS 19.65.070.

During FY2024, Alaska Marine Highway System recorded \$36.3 million in operating revenues, a decrease of \$3.4 million from FY2023. Operating expenditures totaled \$143.3 million, \$15.8 million more than FY2023. Service weeks provided by Alaska Marine Highway System decreased from 247.6 in FY2023 to 236.4 in FY2024.

The Alaska Marine Highway System (AMHS) has successfully navigated significant challenges in FY2024, including addressing the needs of our aging vessels and undertaking critical infrastructure improvements. As we move into FY2025, our efforts will remain focused on major vessel repairs and overhauls. We understand the impacts that service disruptions have on coastal Alaska communities, and these essential improvements will not only strengthen our existing fleet but also pave the way for the construction of new vessels and upgrades to our terminals and docks.

In addition to these infrastructure efforts, we have made meaningful progress in modernizing our services. This includes the implementation of public Wi-Fi on our vessels and initial steps toward upgrading our ticketing and reservation systems. To further enhance the passenger experience, we are also focusing on customer service by expanding bar services and reestablishing gift shops onboard.

Lastly, we are excited to be finalizing the Alaska Marine Highway System 2045 Long Range Plan. During the upcoming legislative session, we will present this plan to the Governor and Legislature, outlining our vision for the future of this vital transportation system. We look forward to engaging in productive discussions as we work together to support and enhance the AMHS for the benefit of all Alaskans.

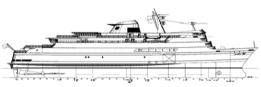

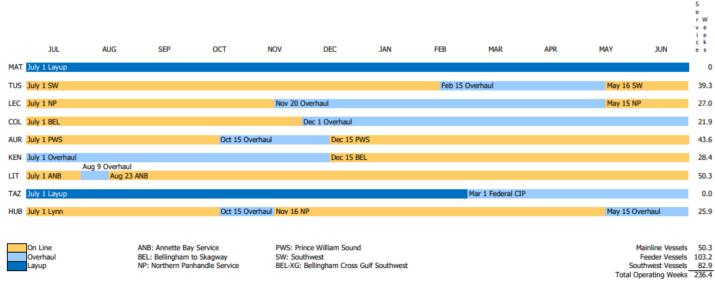

Notes to the Financial Statement

Note 1 – Alaska Marine Highway System Fund

The Alaska Marine Highway System Fund was established July 1, 1990. All gross revenues generated from the operation of the Alaska Marine Highway System are accounted for and remitted in accordance with AS 19.65.070 which mandates that the money shall be deposited in the Alaska Marine Highway System Fund.

Marine Highway Capitalization Account

The Marine Highway Capitalization account was established within the Alaska Marine Highway System Fund June 30, 2009. Access to this funding was restricted and only occurred with approval by the Legislative Budget and Audit Committee.

Note 2 – CIP Program Component

The Alaska Marine Highway System budget includes a component which authorizes positions directly related to capital projects. Beginning in FY2001, the salary cost of time charged directly to capital projects is not recorded in the Alaska Marine Highway Fund. The cost of time charged to administration or overhead is recorded in the Alaska Marine Highway Fund.

Note 3 - Operating and Capital Overhaul

Overhaul expenditures that are included in the Operating Budget are limited to small maintenance items that arise while the vessels are operating and do not include capital overhaul expenditures. Large vessel overhaul and deferred maintenance items are included in the Capital Budget. In FY2024, \$22 million was appropriated for the annual Vessel Overhaul and Deferred Maintenance Capital Budget and \$3.3 was added from the FY24 Supplemental bill.
