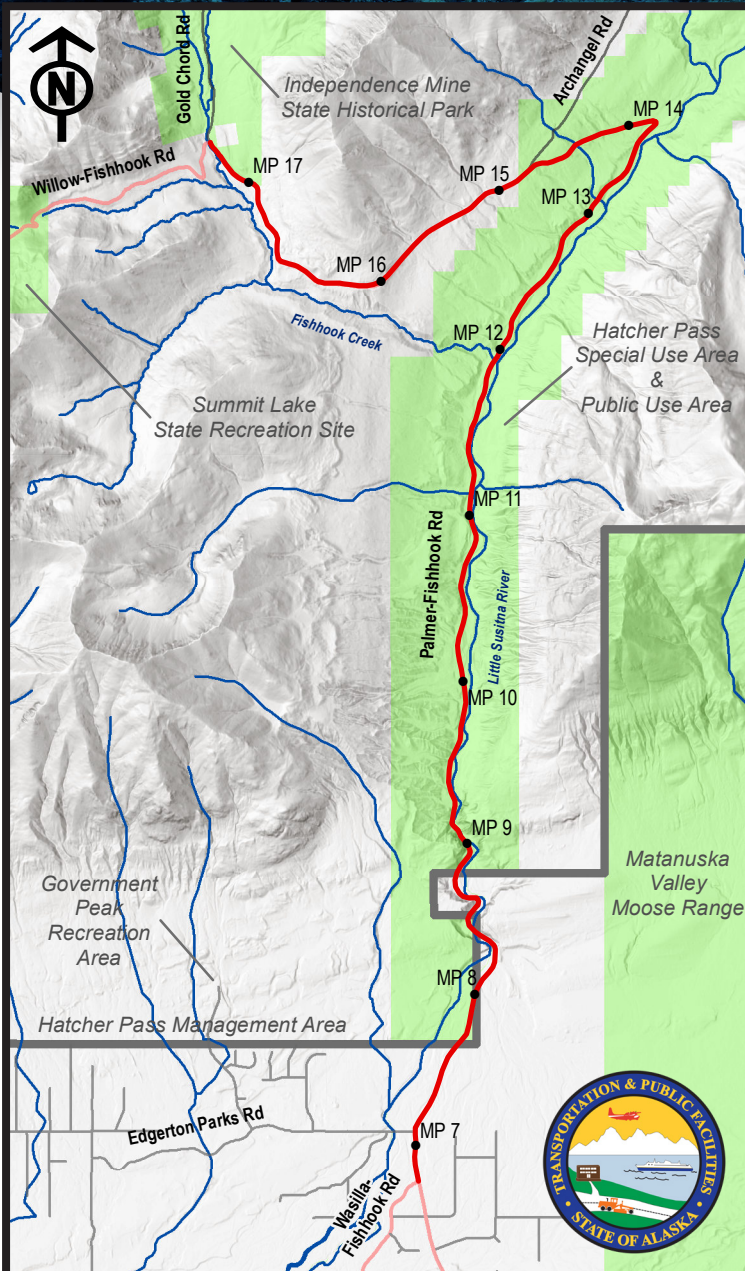
MP 7-17 Pavement Preservation

State Project No. CFHWY00405

Federal Project No. 0580020

The Alaska Department of Transportation and Public Facilities (DOT&PF) is planning to resurface the Palmer-Fishhook Road (Hatcher Pass Road) from the intersection of Wasilla-Fishhook Road (MP 7) through the intersection with Gold Chord Road (MP 17.3). The purpose of the project is to extend the service life of the roadway by removing ruts, cracks, potholes, and protecting the pavement structural section materials. The project may also include, as necessary:

- Reconstruction or rehabilitation of the roadway structural section
- Guardrail replacements
- Drainage and ditching improvements
- Culvert replacements
- Pavement markings
- Signage
- Removal of vegetation



Current Status

- Surveying, field studies, and preliminary engineering are complete.
- Final design is progressing to completion.
- Environmental permits are in development.

Funding

This project is being completed using a combination of state and federal funds.

Project Timeline

- Final design and environmental permits are anticipated to be complete in Spring 2026.
- The project is anticipated to advertise for construction bids in Spring/Summer 2026, depending on funding availability.
