




# Parks Highway MP 99-163 Drainage & Culvert Improvements

## PROJECT OVERVIEW

The Alaska Department of Transportation and Public Facilities, in partnership with the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), is undertaking a project to enhance culverts and drainage infrastructure along the Parks Highway corridor from Milepost 99 to 163.

Numerous culverts and drainage infrastructure in the project area display indications of wear and tear, such as pipe corrosion, blockages in drainage channels, scouring at inlet and outlet points, and other deficiencies. Around 200 culverts have undergone assessment in the project zone, with many of them being over 50 years old from when the Parks Highway was initially constructed. The Department is prioritizing culvert improvements based on their condition, starting with those in critical condition.

## PROPOSED WORK

- Drainage improvements
- Culvert maintenance, replacement, and new installations
- Bridge construction
- Ditch grading
- Digouts and associated resurfacing
- Guardrail
- Signage
- Utility relocations
- Clearing and grubbing

## Parks Highway MP 99-163 Drainage & Culvert Improvements

### PROJECT PHASING

The project is being developed in phases for design and construction.

### Phase 1

Phase 1 is under construction; it will replace 10 culverts in critical condition.

### Phase 2

Phase 2 is under construction; it will replace the 144-inch culvert at Railroad Creek (MP 128.5) with a bridge.

### Phase 3

Phase 3 will replace 7 failing culverts, 2 of which may result in bridge crossings.


### Phase 4

Phase 4 will replace 7 failing culverts, 3 of which may result in bridge crossings.

### Future Phases

Future project phases will address additional culverts in poor condition.

## Project Schedule
