- Drainage improvements
- Culvert maintenance, replacement, and new installations
- Ditch grading

Project Phasing

The project is being developed in phases for design and construction.

- Phase 1 will replace 10 culverts in critical condition.
- Phase 2 will replace the 144-inch culvert at Railroad Creek (MP 128.5) with a bridge.
- <u>Phase 3</u> will replace 11 failing culverts, 3 of which may require bridge crossings.
- Future project phases will address the remaining culverts that are in poor condition.
