Why this project?


- Built in 1980 and showing considerable deterioration
- Limited pedestrian infrastructure
- Non-ADA compliant crossings

Currently this project:

- Redoubt Avenue is owned and maintained by the City of Soldotna
- Smith Way is owned and maintained by the State of Alaska
- At the end of the project, the City of Soldotna will take on ownership and maintenance for Smith Way.

2. PROJECT OVERVIEW

Purpose & Need

Purpose

To improve safety, reduce maintenance costs, and extend the service life of the roadway and pedestrian facilities.

Need

Safety & Usability

The pavement has deteriorated and is potentially unpredictable due to the instability of the materials beneath their surface.

Accessibility

The sidewalks and curbs don't currently provide wheelchair ramps or other features that provide ease of access for all users.



3. DRAFT DESIGN

Project Highlights

Focusing on safety, improvements include:

- Replace pavement sections
- Widen sidewalks and bike lanes
- Add buffers between roadway and sidewalks
- Add crosswalks and new sidewalk connections
- Provide traffic calming measures
- Add landscaping to distinguish right-of-way
- Update curb ramps to be ADA compliant
- Update signage, striping, and storm drains
- Relocate utilities






Working Within Existing Right-Of-Way



The proposed project will not require additional permanant right-of-way (ROW) since all permanent public imporvemnets will be constructed within the existing ROW.



Temporary Construction Easements (TCE) are non-permanent, compensable work areas needed to construct project improvements such as slope limits, curbs, and curb ramps.



Temporary Construction Permits (TCP) are non-permanent, non-compensable work areas needed to reconstruct existing driveways to match the new road surface.



The addition of landscaping elements will help define the existing ROW and discourage adjacent property owners from utilizing the space for personal use, as requested by the City of Soldotna.




