The Alaska Department of Transportation and Public Facilities (DOT&PF) with DOWL, represented the Sterling Safety Corridor Improvements Milepost (MP) 82.5 to 94 project at the Anchorage Transportation Fair on Tuesday, April 15, 2025, at the Alaska Airlines Center in Anchorage.
