1391 Forms

Recently, prime and subcontractors that performed work on FHWA-funded construction projects let by DOT&PF received a request to complete the FHWA-1391 Report along with instructions for completing the report. The 1391 Report is a federal requirement, and is meant to monitor the status of the equal employment opportunity program. If you received this notice, please check with the DOT&PF Civil Rights Office to verify whether you are required to complete this report. Prime and subcontractors on FHWA-funded construction projects let by DOT&PF are required to complete a 1391 report for each contract on which work was performed during the month of July, and where the amount of the contract or subcontract exceeded \$10,000. Completed reports should be submitted to the Civil Rights Office, where they will be compiled into a single report to be submitted to FHWA.

Any questions or concerns regarding the 1391 Report should be addressed to the Civil Rights Office.

OSR(s) must be named on the certification file as a "key" employee at the time the service was rendered and before the application is turned in.
