

Long Combination Vehicles

A Long Combination Vehicle (LCV) means a combination of a power vehicle and cargo-carrying vehicles that exceeds the length specified in 17 AAC 25.012(c).

Allowable LCV Vehicle Length on Certain Routes:

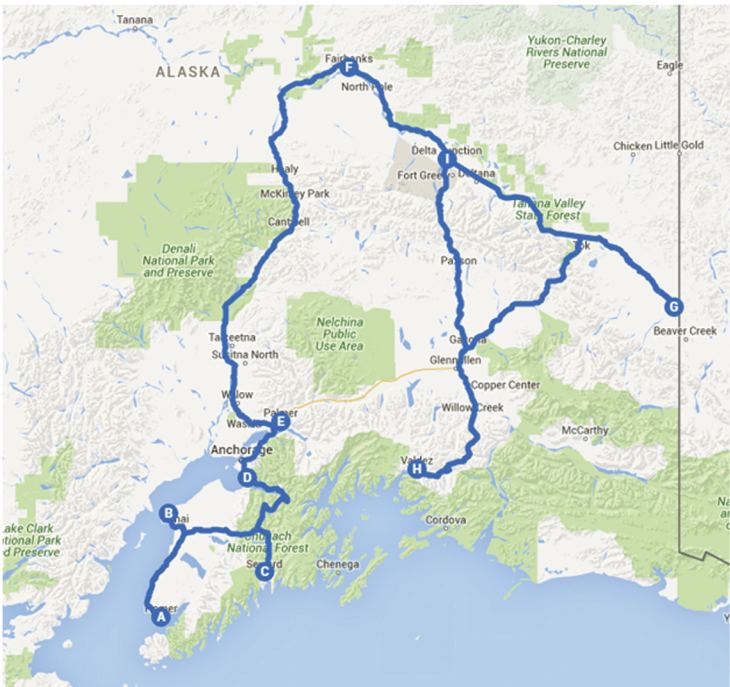
17 AAC 25.014 (a)

Cargo-carrying length cannot exceed 95 feet.

Trailers cannot exceed 48 feet.

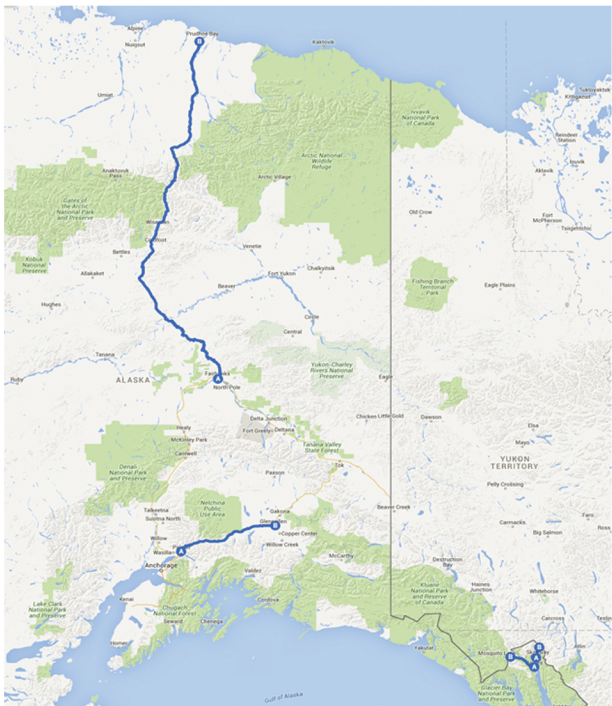
* 17 AAC 25.014(a)(4) Lead Trailer may be 53' on certain routes.

(Measured from the front of the first cargo-carrying vehicle to the rear of the last cargo-carrying vehicle, including the connecting device.)



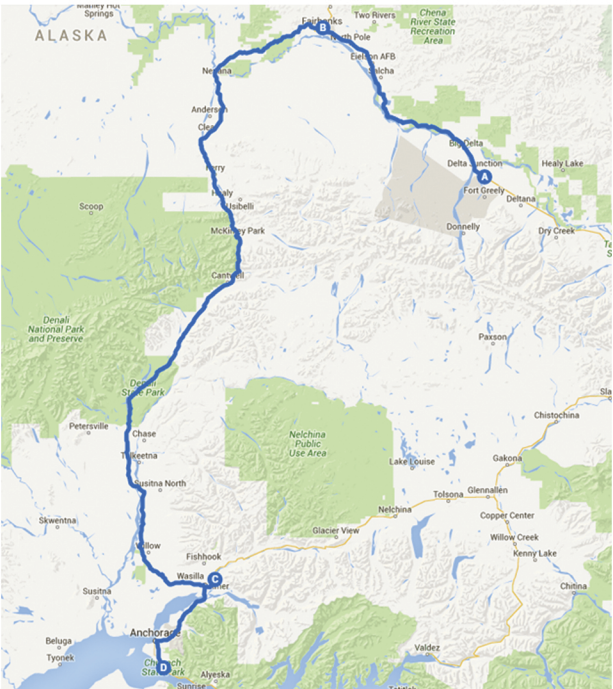
17 AAC 25.014 (c)

Overall length cannot exceed 95 feet.



17 AAC 25.014 (b)

Overall length cannot exceed 90 feet.



17 AAC 25.014 (d)

Overall length cannot exceed 120 feet.

On the Glenn and Parks Highways between Anchorage and Fairbanks between May 1 - September 30 only.

Trailers cannot exceed 28.5 feet.

By Permit Only

- LCVs must:**
- Stop operations during inclement weather.
 - Display an “Oversize” or “Long Load” sign on rear of vehicle.
 - Operate with headlights on at all times.

LCVs may not exceed five miles of reasonable access to and from LCV routes.

Refer to 17 AAC 25.014(f) for a list of LCV routes that may exceed the five mile allowance.
