

Tips on Driving a Roundabout

Rules of a Roundabout

- •SLOW DOWN AS YOU APPROACH. Watch for pedestrians in the crosswalk.
- •YIELD TO TRAFFIC ALREADY IN THE ROUNDABOUT. Look to your left. Traffic already in the roundabout has the right-of-way. If it's a double-lane roundabout yield to both lanes. The speed limit for a yield sign is 15 MPH.
- •ENTER THE ROUNDABOUT WHEN THERE IS A GAP. You do not need to come to a full stop if you can safely enter without stopping. Keep going once you're in the roundabout. You don't yield to traffic that's entering.
- •USE YOUR TURN SIGNAL WHEN EXITING. Alerting other drivers that you will be exiting helps keep traffic flowing. Yield to pedestrians in crosswalk while exiting.
- **DID YOU KNOW?** If an emergency vehicle enters behind you with its lights on, continue to your exit and pull over after you have exited the roundabout.



PRO TIP: THE YIELD

When entering the roundabout, you only need to stop if there is not a safe gap in traffic. If you can enter the roundabout safely without causing a collision, you can keep moving through without stopping.



Always **YIELD** to traffic that's already in the roundabout.
