

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The Gravina Access Project would improve public access between Revillagigedo Island and Gravina Island. Nine build alternatives are evaluated, along with the No Action Alternative. This project is one of 17 high-priority infrastructure projects in the State of Alaska to be federally funded under the Federal Transportation Equity Act for the 21<sup>st</sup> Century (TEA-21), enacted in 1998. A Department of the Army, Corps of Engineers *Public Notice of Application for Permit* for the Gravina Access Project is attached to the EIS in Appendix L for concurrent public review and comment.
