









Project Overview


- Alaska Department of Transportation & Public Facilities (DOT&PF) project
- Rehabilitate 1.3 miles of State Street: 1st Avenue to Skagway River Bridge
- Scope:
 - Resurface pavement
 - Repair subgrade
 - Replace culverts and regrade drainage ditches as necessary
 - Replace storm drain system
 - Replace and upgrade curb ramps
 - Replace driveway curb cuts and sidewalks
 - Install new signage and striping


















Temporary Traffic Control

- Two-way traffic anticipated during project length
- Contractor to work on roadway using half-width construction (half of roadway open while work is completed on other side)
- Work to be broken down by segments. Each segment includes one intersection and extends to just short of the next intersection
- Both sides of segment will be constructed to bottom of pavement prior to moving on to next segment
- Work anticipated to begin at 1st Avenue and end at Skagway River Bridge
- Ore truck and tour bus traffic expected to be maintained on State Street and no signed detours are anticipated
- Temporary access to businesses will be accommodated during construction
- Temporary loss of driveway access and on-street parking is anticipated during construction of each segment




Right of Way (ROW) Acquisition

DOT&PF does everything it can to reduce the impacts of transportation improvements on private property.


Occasionally, additional rights are needed to build highways and sidewalks to current safety standards.
