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Form 25D-62B Instructions:

- 1. Enter the project name, state number, and federal project number as they appear on the contract.
- 2. Enter the contract pay item number and contract item description as they appear on the bid schedule.
- 3. Use a description that allows identification of the item in the retained documentation and at the project site.
- 4. Do not enter a generic description like "all required". Use a quantity that matches the amount represented and retained documentation used to certify cost on Form 25D-60.
- 5. Choose either "domestic" or "non-domestic or unknown origin" as required by Section 106-1.01, Domestic Materials Provision. Provide an updated Form 25D-60, when the cost of non-compliant material counts towards the contract minimal use or de minimis allowance.
- 6. Check this column if the product is a wholly or predominantly iron or steel, or a combination of both as defined in Section 106-1.01, Domestic Materials Provision.
- 7. Check this column if the product is a construction material as defined in Section 106-1.01, Domestic Materials Provision.
- 8. Check this column if the product is a manufactured product as defined in Section 106-1.01, Domestic Materials Provision.
- 9. Check this column if the product is precast concrete or intelligent transportation system (ITS) or other electronic hardware system cabinet or enclosure classified as a manufactured product.
- 10. Manufactured products must be "manufactured in the United States", meaning final assembly of the product occurred in the United States.
- 11. Check this column if FHWA has issued a project-specific waiver for the product.
- 12. Keep a copy of the waiver with the retained documentation when the non-compliant material is subject to an applicable waiver.
- 13. Attach additional form sheets if necessary to include more items.
- 14. Both Manufacturer or Supplier Authorized Representative and Prime Contractor signatures are required.
